

Chapter 182

GOLF CARTS

[HISTORY: Adopted by the Village Board of the Village of Spring Green 12-17-2025 as Ch. 182 of the Village Code. Amendments noted where applicable.]

§ 182-1. Definitions.

As used in this chapter, the following terms shall have the meaning indicated:

GOLF CART – A vehicle whose speed is attainable in one mile, does not exceed 25 miles per hour on a paved, level surface, and that was designed and originally intended to convey one or more persons and equipment to play the game of golf in an area designated as a golf course. State law reference: § 23.33(1)(fm), Wis. Stats.

§ 182-2. Golf Carts Regulated.

- A. Travel by golf carts shall be permitted on all Village streets and alleys, except STH 23 (Winsted Street).
- B. Crossing of STH 23 shall be permitted at any intersection when in compliance with subsection 182-2.
- C. No person shall operate a golf cart on any sidewalk or pedestrian way within the Village.
- D. No person shall operate a golf cart on any private property not owned or controlled by them within the Village without the express consent or permission of the owner.
- E. When operating a golf cart on Village streets and alleyways, the operator shall use the far right-hand side of the roadway; whenever possible, yield to all other motor vehicle traffic; and obey all other motor vehicle laws, as provided in the Wisconsin Motor Vehicle Laws, Statutes, Chapter 346, Rules of the Road.
- F. Golf carts may be operated only on public property in compliance with subsection 182-2, by a properly licensed driver, as provided under Chapter 343 of the Wisconsin Motor Vehicle Laws.
- G. Travel by golf carts shall not be permitted during the hours between sunset and sunrise.
- H. Occupancy on a golf cart is restricted to the number of seats available. A standard golf cart has a single bench for two people.
- I. Golf carts must display a slow-moving vehicle emblem as required by Wis. Stat. 347.245(1).

§ 182-3. Violations and penalties.

Violation of this chapter shall be subject to a forfeiture of not less than \$20 nor more than \$300 together with costs and assessments as prescribed by law.
